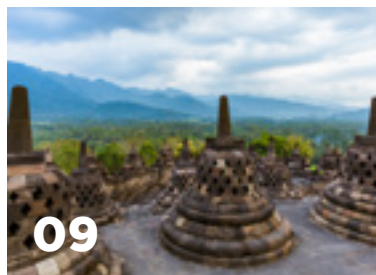
### Scenic Flight Over Mount Everest

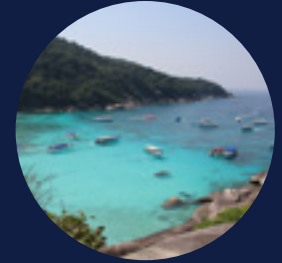
#### Golden Triangle

### *Insider Tip*

Cover up your elbows and knees when visiting temples, wats, monasteries, palaces, etc. We suggest taking a light jacket or shawl even on days when a temple isn't on the itinerary; it's good to be prepared.



## Bangkok

A lively metropolis abundant with temples, Bangkok is booming with energy, sightseeing opportunities, shopping and food. Running through the heart of the city, the Chao Phraya River provides easy access to the city's hot spots. Treat your eyes to a parade of colorful canoes laden with everything from juicy mangoes to jolly-faced souvenirs at the floating markets—a real view into local livelihood.



## Chiang Mai

Dating back 700 years, Chiang Mai's focal point is its Old City, where the walled and moated remains of an imposing fortress still stand. Surrounding this historic site is a blossoming urban area containing all the characteristics of a modern town. Check out the Night Bazaar where locals sell handicrafts alongside merchants hawking jade jewelry, hammered silver plates and reams of silk.



## Chiang Rai

Chiang Rai Province is an area well known for its surrealistic mountain sceneries and some of Thailand's oldest civilizations. This region falls into an area known as the Golden Triangle, where the borders of Thailand, Laos and Myanmar converge. Relentless efforts of the Thai Royal family have transformed the agricultural landscape to one of coffee, tea, fruits and highland crops in neat, terraced fields.



## Phuket

With jagged mountains that shape Phuket's terrain, it is the island's sheltered coves and long stretches of pristine beach that draw most visitors to its shores. The warm waters of the Andaman Sea beckon an abundance of water-based activities, and they yield the best seafood in Thailand. If you can tear yourself away from that perfect spot on the beach, go on a trek to explore Phuket's lush jungles.



## Krabi

Krabi's original identity as a small fishing and trading port can still be seen while strolling through the center of the old town. Today, the province has grown into a world-renowned resort destination. The local folk maintain their rustic charm and are always ready to welcome visitors to the laid-back lifestyle of their home.



## Khao Lak

Khao Lak is a recently discovered travel destination just one hour north of Phuket. Long white-sand beaches offer an exotic escape, while the national parks and mountainous backdrops provide a sense of adventure, ideal for a picturesque and peaceful getaway.



## Koh Samui

Located in the Surat Thani province, Koh Samui is an idyllic island paradise. Surrounded by palm-fringed beaches and blanketed with coconut plantations, this one-time backpackers' nirvana is increasingly popular with a broad range of visitors seeking tranquility. Snorkel off Koh Tao island and experience languid island life or marvel at monkeys shaking off ripe coconuts.

# Street Food

## in Thailand



Nowhere in the world can you find street food as fresh, delicious and affordable as in Thailand, most notably, Bangkok. However, traveling to a culturally unique country like Thailand can be overwhelming for a first-time traveler, so here are some tips to help seek out the best street food in Bangkok.

### 1. Be prepared for a spicy meal!

If you are ready to try eating as the locals do, ask for "thai spicy." However, be warned that most tourists cannot handle this level of spice!

Thai street food is known to be cheap, so order a few different dishes for a real taste into the local culture.

### 3. Look for food stalls with long lines.

Grabbing a quick meal from a local food vendor can be a simple and pure way to connect with the culture. In some cases, popular local cuisine cannot be found on the menu of any restaurant but can be purchased from a street stall on your walk home.

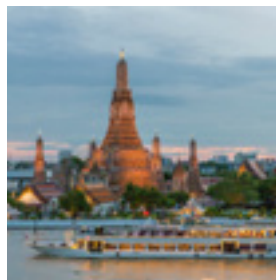

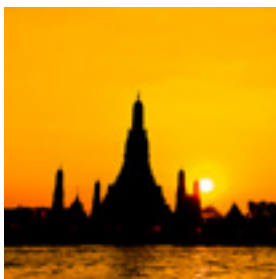
### Chiang Mai Cooking Class

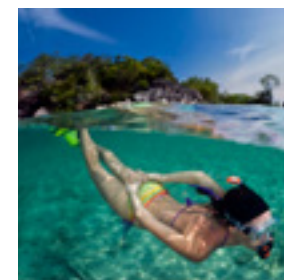

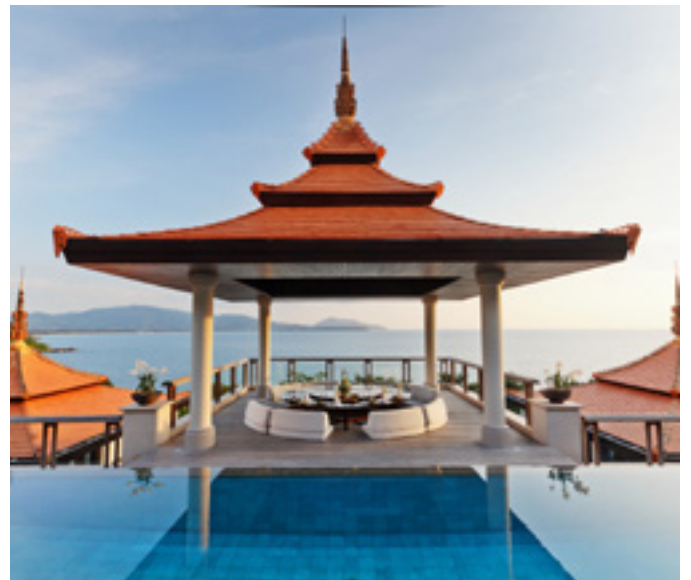

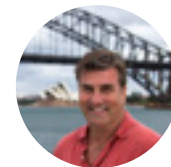

Spend a little time exploring the city and find the magic in these little gems offering a little respite from the mesmerizing chaos!





## Ho Chi Minh City

Formerly known as Saigon, Ho Chi Minh City provides visitors with a glimpse of its 300-year-old history while simultaneously spearheading its eight million residents through the millennium. The old Saigon still survives in wide downtown avenues flanked by pristine colonials. Stop for a breakfast of coffee and croissants at a café before tackling a myriad of museums. Hectic and eclectic, Ho Chi Minh City has an attitude all its own.



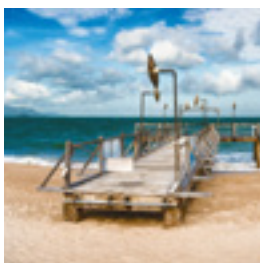
## Hanoi

The capital of Vietnam, Hanoi is a city where tradition reigns supreme. French Colonial houses stand alongside striking skyscrapers in the Old Quarter, while languid lakes dot city parks. Beautiful, quiet streets and neighborhoods flood Hanoi, giving it a gracious, almost regal flavor. Hanoi welcomes visitors to its fine galleries, charismatic stores and exciting dining venues.



## Halong Bay

Home to some 3,000 limestone and dolomite islands (or “grottos”) rising jaggedly from the Gulf of Tonkin, local lore has it that an enormous dragon created the bay as it thrashed its way toward the open sea. There is plenty to explore, and it is easy to find peaceful places to swim, fish or just relax without seeing another soul.



## Nha Trang

Finding its home on Vietnam’s coast, Nha Trang is a place of soft white sand surrounded by warm waters dotted with islands. This palm-lined sandy beach is one of Vietnam’s most popular destinations. A backdrop of mountains to the west and north provides picturesque scenery while serving to protect Nha Trang’s weather patterns, which boast an estimated 250 days of sunshine a year.



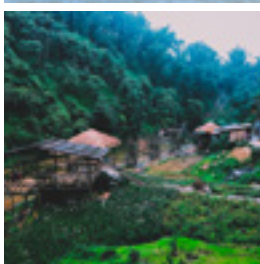
## Hue

Bisected by the Perfume River, the banks south of Hue are home to the many tombs of the Nguyen Emperors. The best way to see the city is by bicycle or longboat. Be sure to arrange stops at Tu Duc—an extensive site with lots of character—Minh Mang, Khai Dinh and the Thien Mu Pagoda—a lovely seven-tiered structure surrounded by gardens.



## Hoi An

Boasting almost 850 historic structures and streetscapes, Hoi An is a walker’s wonderland with timeless treasures waiting to be discovered around every corner. A picturesque river port, Hoi An turns its gaze inwards to its rich history. Wander among historic homes and temples, stop to lounge in an open-air café and gaze at the exotic foods in the market or take a sampan ride down the river.



## Sapa

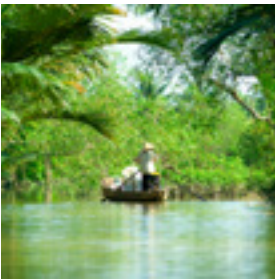

Protruding from the jungle, the ancient city of Angkor Wat is the main attraction to visitors of Siem Reap. The city's proximity to the legendary sandstone complex makes it the ideal base camp for day trips and longer itineraries. Relax and unwind in a local restaurant after a long day of exploring the world's largest religious monument or don your walking shoes and set off on the 60-square-miles of passageways and palaces.

Beneath Cambodia's clatter of rickshaws and motorbikes lies the serenity of aging French Colonial mansions and temples that contrast with Phnom Penh's chaotic landscape. Housed within the showy walls of the Royal Palace sits the Silver Pagoda, a fascinating structure lined with 5,000 blocks of silver weighing over six tons. This lavish abode holds a 17th century Buddha cut from Baccarat Crystal and another Buddha made almost entirely of gold and dripping with approximately 10,000 diamonds.

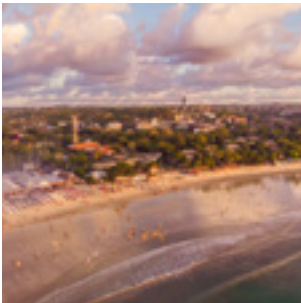
## Ubud

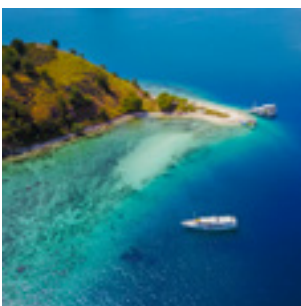

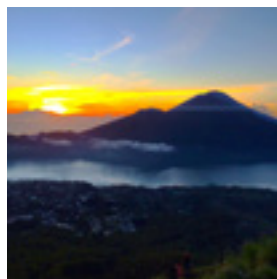

Made of volcanic minerals and lava from Mount Agung, the sand is surprisingly soft, and the specks of black and silver glisten in the sun. 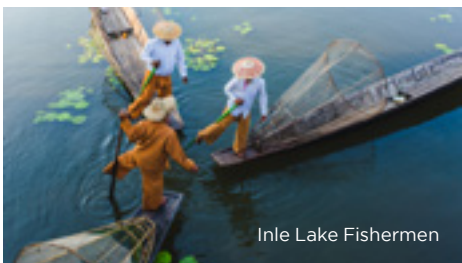

Do yourself a favor by double-checking that you are able to use your card for withdrawals on your trip; this will save you a lot of frustration. 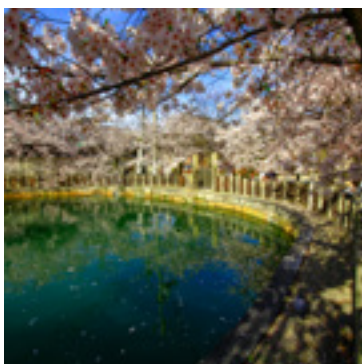
## Kyoto

# Sushi Etiquette



Chefs may study for decades to master the art of sushi-making. Applying basic sushi etiquette and appreciating their creations the proper way shows respect to generations of effort. When preparing to eat sushi, a wet towel is provided to cleanse your hands before you dig in, mostly because the traditional way to eat maki and nigiri sushi is with the fingers.

When it comes to soy sauce, pour only a small amount, as wasting soy sauce is taboo in Japanese dining etiquette. And though you may enjoy mixing wasabi in the soy sauce, that is not the proper way to eat sushi. However, this is acceptable behavior when eating sashimi. Sashimi is typically eaten with chopsticks, but the traditional way is to lift a piece between your thumb and middle finger, dipping only the fish (never the rice!) in the soy sauce. Pieces should also be eaten fish-side-down to experience the complex flavors of the sushi.

The most important rule on how to properly eat sushi is to enjoy every bite! Upon exiting an establishment, give a deep, respectful bow to the chef to show your appreciation for the meal.

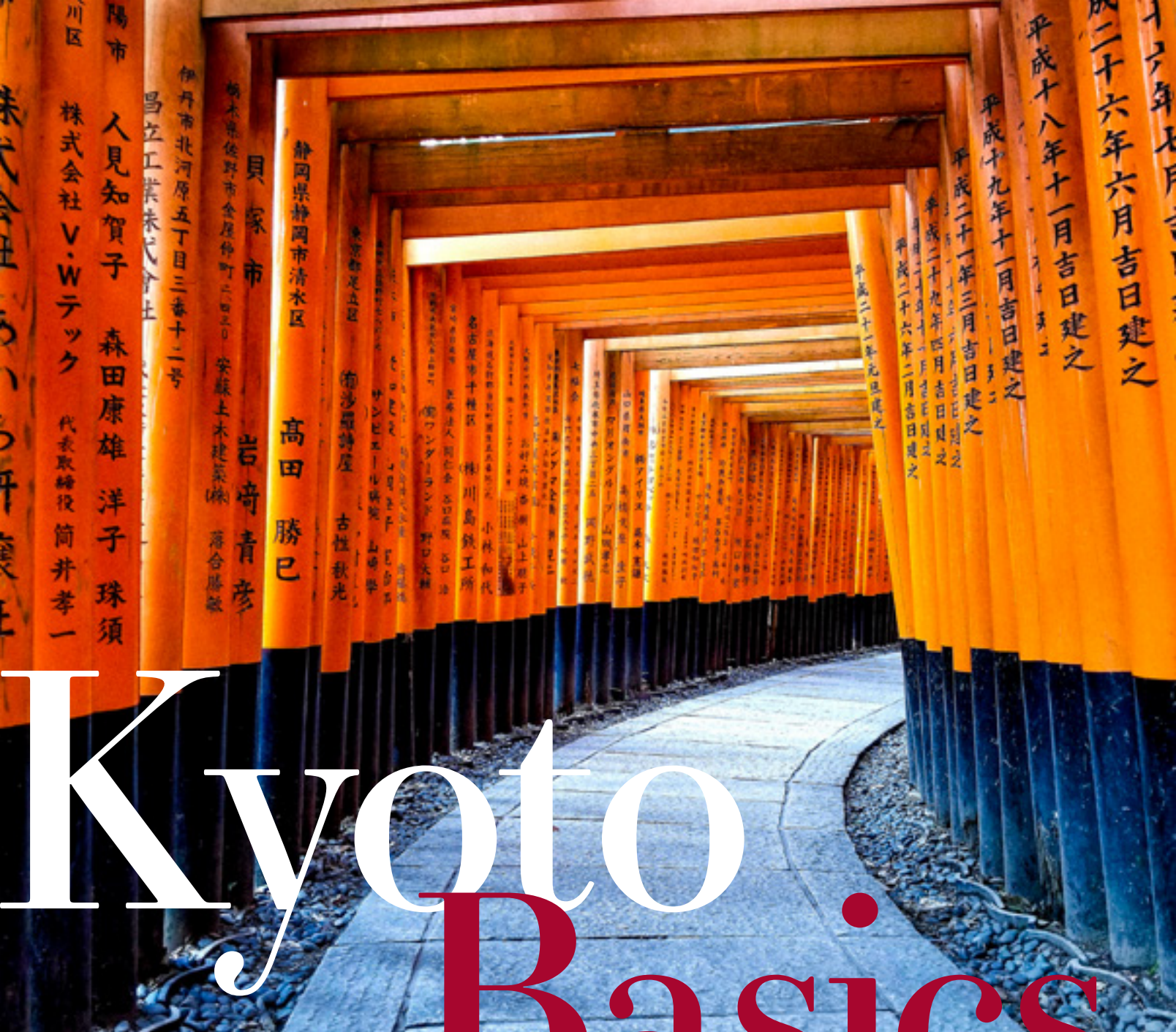

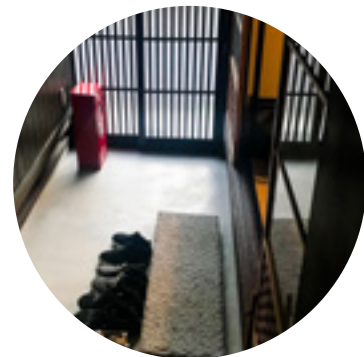
# Kyoto Basics

Throughout our trip to Japan, which included visits to Fukuoka, Osaka, Kyoto and Tokyo, we found ourselves saying “if only we had another day here” as we left each city.

This was most true of Kyoto; home to many famous historic landmarks in the country, it is a must-see destination when traveling to Japan, especially if it is your first time visiting.

## The Machiya

We decided to forgo staying in a hotel while in Kyoto and elected to stay at a machiya—a traditional Kyoto townhouse. We wanted to make sure to spend time in a traditional Japanese home. When entering the house, there is a small room where you remove your shoes before entering the main house. Once your shoes are off, you slide open the wooden door to reveal a simple, warm space that instantly reminds you that you are in Japan.



The walls are plain yet detailed, the floors are covered with tatami mats and the furniture is all designed for use while kneeling or sitting on the ground. The space, which none of us had ever experienced before, was so inviting that we felt as if we had just walked into our home. While there were two normal beds in one bedroom, the second bedroom was much more traditional, with two futons available to complete the machiya experience. The bathroom had a regular shower only with a wooden soaking tub that allowed you to relax and look out into the small garden at the back of the property. Staying in the machiya felt as if it was integral to our experience in Kyoto, and we quite enjoyed our time relaxing and taking in the experience of simply being in the house.



## Authentic Ramen

We knew we wanted ramen for dinner the first night in Kyoto, and we knew of one restaurant that offers a unique take on the dish. Menbakaichidai Ramen serves traditional Japanese ramen with one big twist: fire. Commonly referred to as “Fire Ramen,” this small restaurant serves up ramen that is literally set on fire in front of you. The fire ignites when the chef pours a small amount of hot oil onto a healthy amount of green onion that is piled on top of the bowl. This ignites a flame that reaches several feet in the air and lasts for maybe about a second. The process releases a unique flavor into the dish unlike any ramen you have ever had. Depending on which set you order, you can add sides of fried rice, gyoza and karaage (Japanese-style fried chicken) to your meal. A spectacle that is every bit as entertaining as it is delicious, combined with extremely friendly staff, makes this a definite stop for any ramen fan.



We then made our way to Kiyomizu-dera, another beautiful Kyoto landmark. This Buddhist temple is located on a hillside near the edge of the city and offers stunning traditional architecture, spectacular views of the surrounding areas and a rich historical experience.



## The Highlights of Kyoto

At the recommendation of the staff at Fire Ramen, we made our way over to the nearby Nijo Castle. While this site is generally closed in the evening, in the fall season it is sometimes open to the public after dark. We not only got to explore the grounds, but also took a walk through the palace, which was beautifully lit for the evening hours.

The next morning was Fushimi Inari-taisha, one of Kyoto’s most famous shrines, and rightfully so. The shrine is located at the base of Inari mountain. Two-and-a-half-miles of trails take you up and down the mountain, with smaller shrines scattered all along the way. The most unique aspect of Fushimi Inari is the seemingly endless number of torii gates that line the trails. Walking the trail and passing under these beautiful gates is an extremely relaxing experience that takes anywhere from two to three hours to complete.

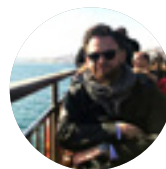
Those who take the time to really explore the trails and find some lesser traveled paths will be rewarded with breathtaking views of Kyoto. Be sure to get there early in the morning to avoid large crowds and have a much more enjoyable experience.



## Arashiyama District

Finally, we decided to make a trip to the Arashiyama district. Arashiyama offers visitors a great variety of historic temples and shrines, a plentiful number of small shops and restaurants, and of course, the famous Bamboo Grove. Much quieter than central Kyoto, this area feels like a small getaway within the city.

Kyoto is an amazing city with a rich history that keeps anyone who visits captivated. While we did see quite a bit of Kyoto, we only scratched the surface of what the city has to offer. This, of course, just makes the build-up to the next trip to Japan that much more enticing.

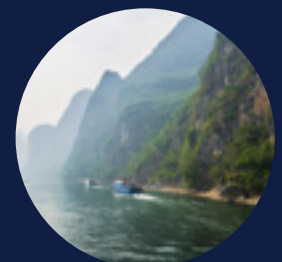

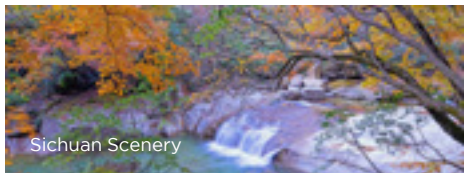

The Chinese way of life is very different to most Western cultures, so we suggest to read up on traditions and etiquette practices in the region you are traveling to before you go. Learning a few phrases in the language will go a long way.



## Beijing

Beijing is China's capital and the country's second-largest city, and it is home to several of the country's most revered icons, with more than 50 museums and cultural centers. Stroll through palaces, temples and parks where emperors once walked. Be sure to visit the alleys, known as hutongs, which give a view into Beijing's cultural past. Though filled with history, Beijing is a modern-day metropolis.



## Xi'an

Capital of Shaanxi Province, Xi'an dates back more than 3,000 years. An important stop on the famous Silk Road, Xi'an has long been a stopover for those from Central Asia and the Middle East. In modern days, the city is known for the Terracotta Warriors. Unearthed from the tomb of Emperor Qin Shihuang, more than 7,000 life-sized soldiers stand as one of China's most alluring historical sites.



## Chengdu

Capital of the Sichuan region, Chengdu is famous for its giant pandas and spicy cuisine. Chengdu is also home to many teahouses, an important part of its cultural heritage. A significant part of the city is the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding, a sanctuary for these endangered animals. Nearby is the Wolong National Nature Reserve, home to golden monkeys, golden langurs and more than 500 pandas.



## Shanghai

Formerly known as the "Paris of the East," Shanghai is a contemporary city with much to offer. From the Bund on the Huangpu River, facing toward Pudong, to the impressive sculptures found in the Shanghai Museum, the city boasts an air of modernity. Wind your way through a maze of Ming Dynasty pavilions in the Yu Yuan Garden, or shop and people-watch on Nanjing Road.



## Suzhou

Surrounded by remnants of a moat and canals, Suzhou has become a protected historical district in which little tampering exists. The outlines of old Suzhou are imprinted through its maze of waterways and bridges. No other Chinese city contains such a large concentration of gardens, among which the most perfect is the Master of the Nets Garden, a landscape hidden at the end of a blind alley.



## Guilin

With bamboo forests and mist-covered hills, Guilin's surroundings look surreal. Guilin is bisected by the Li River, so you can spot oxen grazing at the river's edge or marvel at the sight of limestone hills. For subterranean splendor, look no further than the Reed Flute Cave. Walk through the vast network of chambers dripping with stalactites and elaborate rock formations while learning of their role in local folklore.

# Chinese Lantern Festival



Festivals play a major role in Chinese culture. One of the most well-known is the Lantern Festival. This celebration marks the last day of the traditional celebration of the Chinese New Year. For many, letting the lantern fly away into the night symbolizes letting go of the past and moving into the new year with a fresh start. The lanterns are traditionally red, a color that represents good fortune in Chinese culture.



Many years ago, when the festival began, young Chinese people flooded the streets in hopes of finding love. The brightest lanterns symbolized good luck and hope, characteristics of a good love match. Although the tradition of finding love during the festival no longer remains true, the symbols of luck and hope are still representative of the annual Lantern Festival today.

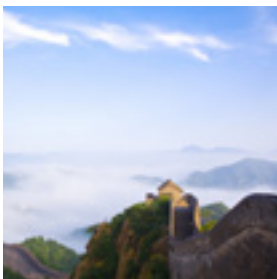

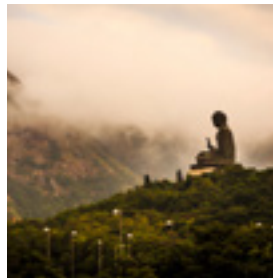

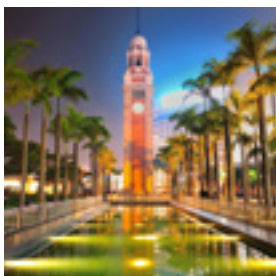

## Paro

A wide valley covered in fertile rice fields, this picturesque region is the gateway to Bhutan. Accentuating the natural beauty are the many elegant traditional-style houses that dot the valley and surrounding hills. Paro has grown in recent years and offers visitors a choice of restaurants, bakeries and cafes, as well as hiking and temple touring. Home to one of the most iconic monasteries, Taktsang, or Tiger's Nest, this interesting town is a must-do destination.



## Thimphu

Thimphu is Bhutan's capital and most modern city; it offers guests an abundance of restaurants, internet cafes, nightclubs and shopping centers. However, it still retains a cultural identity and traditional values amidst the signs of modernization. Thimphu is one of the few towns in Bhutan equipped with ATM banking facilities, and it is a good place to stock up on some currency.



## Punakha

At an elevation of 4,000 feet above sea level, Punakha Valley has a pleasant climate with warm winters and hot summers; thus, it offers favorable conditions for rice farming. Visitors to Punakha Dzongkhag will be met with beautiful scenery, as well as the majestic Punakha Dzong. It is the second-oldest and second-largest dzong in Bhutan, and it served as the country's capital from 1637 to 1907.



## Bumthang

Bumthang is located in central Bhutan, an area with the greatest abundance of historic and religious sites. Here, temple-touring enthusiasts can find some of the country's oldest monasteries and Buddhist temples. Bumthang Dzongkhag consists of four main valleys: Ura, Chumey, Tang and Choekhor. Carved by ancient glaciers, these wide and scenic valleys draw a large number of tourists each year.



## Gangtey

Considered one of the most beautiful spots in Bhutan, Gangtey is a flat valley with very few trees, and it is quite different from the rest of the country. This area is home to Jigme Singye Wangchuk National Park, a natural habitat for a variety of wildlife, including nesting grounds for endangered black-necked cranes. Witness these graceful birds at the Gangtey Monastery, where they spend the winter before returning home to Tibet.

The impressive architecture of the structure reflects Buddhist tradition. Gold is prominent across the design, bringing attention to the illuminated golden idols. Almost every room is equipped with a balcony, allowing the impressive natural surroundings to be proudly featured. An important landmark for the Buddhist religion, countless famous monks have visited the monastery since it opened.

## New Delhi

The centerpiece of India's carefully planned capital is Connaught Place, a vibrant circle of bars and banks, restaurants and renowned shopping. Stroll down the beautiful Raj Path and enjoy its quaint gardens and ornamental ponds.



## Agra

Discover the timelessness of love in Agra, home of the Taj Mahal. Agra served as capital for the Mughal Empire during the 16th and 17th centuries and flourished as a center of art, drawing inspiration from a mix of styles. It has been immortalized by the Taj Mahal, yet Agra has so many more monuments that tell a rich narrative of the tides and times of man.



## Jaipur

Jaipur is known as "the pink city" for the color of its older buildings. Traditionally, pink was considered the color of hospitality. The city's hue is brilliantly displayed in the Hawa Mahal, or Palace of Winds, which radiates an orange-pink glow in the rising sun. Exquisitely carved gates divide the city into neat rectangles, making sightseeing surprisingly easy.



## Udaipur

Known as the "City of Sunrise," Udaipur is described as the most romantic city in India. The city is built around the picturesque Lake Pichola. The labyrinth of temples and havelis (ornate houses) invites hours of quiet contemplation. The two islands in the lake command attention with their lotus-lined waters and floating palaces, one of which was formerly the royal summer palace.



## Varanasi

A crumbling maze of a city that rises from the steps on the western banks of the Ganges, Varanasi is in many senses the quintessential India. Seen by devotees as the holiest of Indian pilgrimages, Varanasi is where the devout come to wash away their sins. Cruise the waterfront at dawn and witness the most surreal scenes when devotees come to bathe and meditate.



## Mumbai

Mumbai, formerly known as Bombay, contains the heart of Hindi cinema known as Bollywood. Cramped onto a narrow strip of land that curls from the coast into the Arabian Sea, Mumbai has morphed from being a fishing settlement into a sprawling megalopolis of 12 million people. Mumbai attracts people from all backgrounds, classes and social strata, coming together in search of economic prosperity and growth.

Donned in clean white clothing, neighbors and strangers begin to sprinkle each other with gulas, a colored powder. Each color has a meaning: red represents love and happiness, while blue is symbolic of vitality. Music fills the air as smiling friends and family dance through the streets. Holi is an experience that cannot be missed.



Diwali is known as the festival of lights. For five days, the festival celebrates the return of exiled King Rama and is one of the most important traditions in Indian culture. All buildings and homes are decorated with bright lights and colorful flowers. During this holiday, it is customary to exchange gifts with loved ones, as well as offer a simple "Happy Diwali" to anyone you may pass.

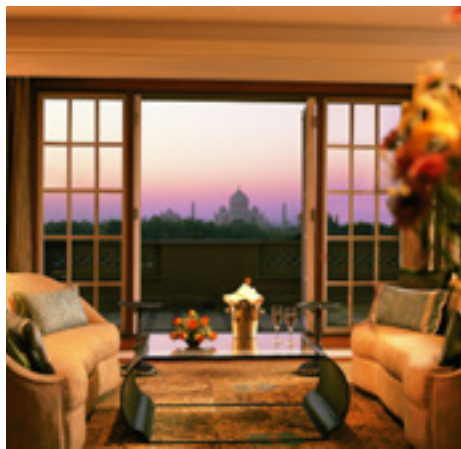

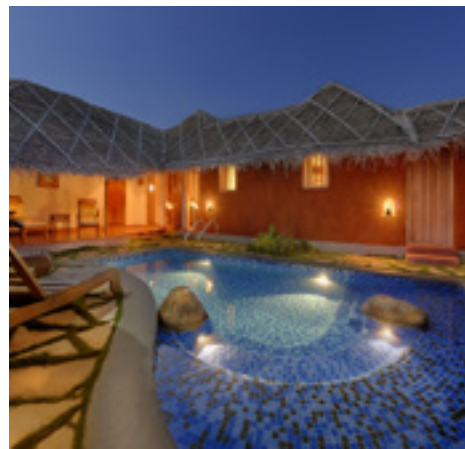

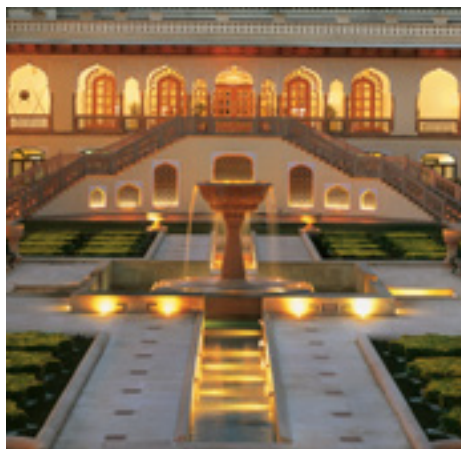

# 5 Days in South India



## Day 1

I flew from Bangalore to Madurai before embarking on a two-hour drive to Chettinad, where I stayed at the Visalam Hotel.

In February, when the weather is pleasant in South India, I traveled to Chettinad and Tamil Nadu to explore the Hindu temples of Madurai and Thanjavur. The exquisite Chettiar cuisine was another reason for my visit! I flew from Bangalore to Madurai—a short non-stop flight on Jet Air. Unfortunately, the airline didn't transport my bag to Madurai, so I was forced to go shopping.

Equipped with local colorful clothes, I was excited! After an easy two-hour drive from Madurai to Chettinad, I arrived at the Visalam Hotel. It is a grand 75-year-old house that has been converted to luxurious simplicity. The rooms are very large, and one could feel the heritage, art and architecture of olden times.

## Day 2

Today, I explored Chettinad on a bullock cart.

After a delicious steaming local South Indian filter coffee, we walked around the village and admired the abandoned mansions that lie still with its history of the past. Later on, I took a bullock cart ride and stopped by some local structures. Its architecture of open courtyards, tall steel pillars and beautiful tile work was impressive. It seemed



that time has stopped here and I was living in the past. The Chettiars—a caste of traders and bankers—built these mansions beginning in mid-19th century and ending just after India's independence. Most of these homes are looked after by caretakers now—the Chettiars long gone from them.

This place is so unlike any other part of India. The region is also full of beautiful boutique hotels, local tours and cooking classes. I was lucky enough to also visit the cotton weavers, the Athangudi Tile Factory and a Shiva temple.

Late Morning, I visited Chettinad's capital of Karaikuddi. I enjoyed a lunch with a 75-year-old doyen of Chettinad culture and cuisine at Bangala Mansion. Her mansion was full of guests from all over the world enjoying the cuisine!

**I drove to Thanjavur and enjoyed a culinary session and cultural performance at Hotel Svatma.**



From Chettinad to Thanjavur—the drive was about three hours. Welcomed by tall trees and the beautiful fragrance of jasmine, I arrived at Hotel Svatma. The hotel has a spiritual feel with an indulgence of luxury. In the afternoon, I took part in a culinary session with a local chef. I learned to make the South Indian snack of panyarams and a traditional South Indian sweet sheera.

In the evening, I enjoyed an amazing dance performance of Bharat Natyam. The young dancer had traveled six hours from Chennai to perform! That night, my lost bag (completely intact!) arrived at the hotel. I was more than delighted!

## Day 3

**Today, I visited the 11th century Brihadeeswarar Temple and toured the Thanjavur streets.**

The morning began quietly with the local in-house priest chanting the Vedas. My guide for the day took me to the 11th century Brihadeeswarar Temple—a

UNESCO World Heritage monument. Of its sculptures, the most distinct ones are those of Shiva's 108 dancing postures. Following this, I visited the bronze-casting and bronze gallery. Afterwards, we walked Thanjavur's streets to explore its cultural heritage. I met the Tanjore painting artist and explored Bommali Kolu—the wooden and clay dolls. I even bought a clay doll as a souvenir since they are locally crafted.

## Day 4

**I explored the 16th century Nayakar Palace and visited the famous Meenakshi Temple.**

The breakfast at Svatma was a wonderful spread of East and West cuisines. Omelets for the Western palates and fresh, thin rice and lentil pancakes (called dosa) for those who wanted to try the local fare. An easy drive on a well-paved road was a comfortable way to reach

Madurai. After checking into the hotel, I went to explore the palace and then the famous Meenakshi Temple. Many people were there for prayers and blessings. The architecture of the temple is stunning.

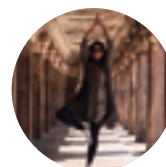


## Day 5

# Swain Destinations Terms and Conditions

The following Terms and Conditions represent the agreement you enter with Swain Destinations when submitting payment for any services provided by Swain Australia Tours (2003) Inc. doing business as Swain Destinations (collectively "Swain"). Please read these terms and conditions carefully prior to submitting payment.

## A. Limited Principal and Agent Relationship

These Terms and Conditions establish a relationship of principal and agent between you, as principal, and Swain, as agent. As your agent, Swain acts pursuant to your authority and may bind you only to the extent of such authority. Swain may dispose of funds received from you only with your express authorization. By these Terms and Conditions, you grant Swain such express authorization for the purpose of booking travel. Swain is also an agent of transportation carriers and other third-party suppliers of services ("suppliers"). All suppliers are independent contractors. When coordinating travel services, Swain receives funds from you and transmits those funds to suppliers. In exchange, suppliers provide you with travel services, which are coordinated by Swain. Swain is a broker between suppliers and customers. Swain receives only a portion of the funds collected from you as a commission, which compensates Swain for services it has rendered to you.

## B. Payment Schedule

For airfare arrangements, the full fare must be paid at time of booking. All airfare payments are in addition to the booking deposits for land arrangements.

All travelers must pay a \$500 non-refundable land deposit, per person, at the time of reservation and, if applicable, the non-refundable insurance premium. Certain special or customized itineraries may require an additional deposit. Final payment is due 60 days prior to departure. For Africa Travel, a 25% land deposit of the total booking cost is due at time of reservation and, if applicable, the non-refundable insurance premium. Final payment is due 100 days prior to departure. Certain special or customized itineraries may require an additional deposit. For late bookings within 30 days of departure, full payment is due immediately. An additional fee of \$50 per person will be charged for rush handling. Festive seasons vary by destination and calendar year. Travel during festive seasons may require an earlier deposit date or increased deposit. This will be advised at time of quote.

## C. Cancellations, Revisions and Changes

All deposits are non-refundable. All booking cancellations, revisions, and changes are subject to terms and limitations.

**Independent Travelers.** If you cancel 60 or more days prior to departure, only the deposit is forfeited. If you cancel 59 to 7 days prior to departure, you forfeit 30% of the total cost. If you cancel 6 days or less prior to departure, you forfeit 100% of the total cost. For Africa Travel: If you cancel 100 or more days prior to departure, only the deposit is forfeited. If you cancel 99 days or less prior to departure, you forfeit 100% of the total cost.

**Escorted Tours.** If you cancel 60 or more days prior to departure, only the deposit is forfeited. If you cancel 59 to 15 days prior to departure, you forfeit 30% of the total cost. If you cancel 14 to five days prior to departure, you forfeit 35% of the total cost. If you cancel four to one days prior to departure, you forfeit 60% of the total cost. If you cancel on or after the date of departure, you forfeit 100% of the total cost. For air-only itineraries, all cancellations are subject to a \$100 Swain processing fee, and are further subject to the terms and conditions of the airline(s).

Swain will make no refund for elements of a travel package not used by the customer. In all cases, all travelers are solely responsible for charges assessed by land suppliers, cruise companies, and airlines. A handling fee of \$50 per person plus any fees charged by the supplier will be charged for any alterations or revisions to a reservation. Spelling corrections to clients' names after tickets have been issued are subject to airline revision fees.
