



The elephants have been rescued from tourism and logging industries, so you are supporting a new life for these incredible creatures.



Purification Ceremony at Puri Tirta Empul Ubud, Bali

Pura Tirta Empul is a Hindu temple, considered to be one of the holiest temples in Bali. Located near the town of Ubud, it draws people from all over the island to do a purification ceremony. When you participate in this spiritual experience, make sure to be respectful of the ritual's customs.



Gilded Temples of Luang Prabang Luang Prabang, Laos

Stay in a Wildlife Sanctuary Lodge

There are amazing accommodations all over the world, but true Wildlife Sanctuary Lodges are unique in that proceeds go towards local conservation programs. A fantastic example is Singita, whose anti-poaching canine unit would not be as successful as it is today without the direct contributions of its guests. Renowned for its award-winning safari lodges and reserves, Singita is also a conservation and eco-tourism brand looking to preserve Southern and Eastern Africa's wildlife, communities and landscapes.

Participate in wildlife encounters benefiting the animals and the community

Seeing wildlife in their natural habitat is a thrilling and humbling experience, but it is important to find a partner whose offerings are ethical. For example, swimming with whale sharks in Western Australia does not involve baiting; instead, sharks are spotted via helicopter, which then directs the boat to that location. Gorilla trekking is another great example: by making permits for tracking mountain gorillas more valuable than poaching, the Rwandan government has eradicated gorilla poaching in the country.

Take part in conservation activities that rehabilitate and protect endangered animals

With Echidna Walkabout, visitors can encounter koalas in the wild while helping to preserve their habitat by clearing weeds that deter koalas from climbing eucalyptus trees, which is their primary source of food. Looking for something slightly more demanding? Care for Wild Rhino Sanctuary in South Africa offers a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to make an immediate difference on the white and black rhino population. From learning how to treat injured or abandoned rhinos to bottle-feeding orphaned calves who have lost their mothers to poaching, this is an experience that will change you forever.









Bangkok

A lively metropolis abundant with temples, Bangkok is booming with energy, sightseeing opportunities, shopping and food. Running through the heart of the city, the Chao Phraya River provides easy access to the city's hot spots. Treat your eyes to a parade of colorful canoes laden with everything from juicy mangoes to jolly-faced souvenirs at the floating markets—a real view into local livelihood.



Chiang Mai

Dating back 700 years, Chiang Mai's focal point is its Old City, where the walled and moated remains of an imposing fortress still stand. Surrounding this historic site is a blossoming urban area containing all the characteristics of a modern town. Check out the Night Bazaar where locals sell handicrafts alongside merchants hawking jade jewelry, hammered silver plates and reams of silk.



Chiang Rai

Chiang Rai Province is an area well known for its surrealistic mountain sceneries and some of Thailand's oldest civilizations. This region falls into an area known as the Golden Triangle, where the borders of Thailand, Laos and Myanmar converge. Relentless efforts of the Thai Royal family have transformed the agricultural landscape to one of coffee, tea, fruits and highland crops in neat, terraced fields.



Phuket

With jagged mountains that shape Phuket's terrain, it is the island's sheltered coves and long stretches of pristine beach that draw most visitors to its shores. The warm waters of the Andaman Sea beckon an abundance of water-based activities, and they yield the best seafood in Thailand. If you can tear yourself away from that perfect spot on the beach, go on a trek to explore Phuket's lush jungles.



Krabi

Krabi's original identity as a small fishing and trading port can still be seen while strolling through the center of the old town. Today, the province has grown into a world-renowned resort destination. The local folk maintain their rustic charm and are always ready to welcome visitors to the laid-back lifestyle of their home.




Khao Lak

Khao Lak is a recently discovered travel destination just one hour north of Phuket. Long white-sand beaches offer an exotic escape, while the national parks and mountainous backdrops provide a sense of adventure, ideal for a picturesque and peaceful getaway.



Koh Samui

Located in the Surat Thani province, Koh Samui is an idyllic island paradise. Surrounded by palm-fringed beaches and blanketed with coconut plantations, this one-time backpackers' nirvana is increasingly popular with a broad range of visitors seeking tranquility. Snorkel off Koh Tao island and experience languid island life or marvel at monkeys shaking off ripe coconuts.





Ho Chi Minh City pulsates with an intoxicating energy and excitement day and night. Within this vibrant city you can find hole-in-the-wall restaurants, lost-in-time cafés and bespoke encounters. Spend a little time exploring the city and find the magic in these little gems offering a little respite from the mesmerizing chaos!



Ho Chi Minh City

Formerly known as Saigon, Ho Chi Minh City provides visitors with a glimpse of its 300-year-old history contrasted with modern ideals and architecture. The old Saigon still survives in wide downtown avenues flanked by pristine colonials. Stop for a breakfast of coffee and croissants at a café before tackling a myriad of museums. Hectic and eclectic, Ho Chi Minh City has an attitude all its own.



Hanoi

The capital of Vietnam, Hanoi is a city where tradition reigns supreme. French Colonial houses stand alongside striking skyscrapers in the Old Quarter, while languid lakes dot city parks. Beautiful, quiet streets and neighborhoods flood Hanoi, giving it a gracious, almost regal flavor. Hanoi welcomes visitors to its fine galleries, charismatic stores and exciting dining venues.



Halong Bay

Home to some 3,000 limestone and dolomite islands (or "grottos") rising jaggedly from the Gulf of Tonkin, local lore has it that an enormous dragon created the bay as it thrashed its way toward the open sea. There is plenty to explore, and it is easy to find peaceful places to swim, fish or just relax without seeing another soul.



Nha Trang

Finding its home on Vietnam's coast, Nha Trang is a place of soft white sand surrounded by warm waters dotted with islands. This palm-lined sandy beach is one of Vietnam's most popular destinations. A backdrop of mountains to the west and north provides picturesque scenery while serving to protect Nha Trang's weather patterns, which boast an estimated 250 days of sunshine a year.



Hue

Bisected by the Perfume River, the banks south of Hue are home to the many tombs of the Nguyen Emperors. The best way to see the city is by bicycle or longboat. Be sure to arrange stops at Tu Duc—an extensive site with lots of character—Minh Mang, Khai Dinh and the Thien Mu Pagoda—a lovely seven-tiered structure surrounded by gardens.




Hoi An

Boasting almost 850 historic structures and streetscapes, Hoi An is a walker's wonderland with timeless treasures waiting to be discovered around every corner. A picturesque river port, Hoi An turns its gaze inwards to its rich history. Wander among historic homes and temples, stop to lounge in an open-air café and gaze at the exotic foods in the market or take a sampan ride down the river.



Sapa

Nestled amongst the Hoang Lien Mountains near the Chinese border, Sapa is a wonderfully colorful town. Famous for its pristine environment, lush rice fields, unparalleled scenery and cool climate, Sapa is home to more than 30 thriving hill tribes. You will find people from the local H'mong and Dzao hill tribes selling their produce, clothing and handicrafts in the town's market every day.



Vietnam's northwestern Hoang Lien Mountains are the perfect place for travelers in search of rugged natural beauty and unique local culture. Travel from Hanoi to Sapa, where you will experience the magic of the region's terraced rice fields, mountain trails, hill tribe villages and colorful markets.



Begin your adventure at Mong Sen village, where you can enjoy spectacular views as you trek towards Ta Phin village, inhabited by H'mong and Dzao people. Return to Sapa for the night, then spend the following day hiking through forested hills in search of the picturesque villages of Cat Cat, Y Linh Ho and Lao Chai.



Returning to the hotel in the late afternoon, you will transfer to Lao Cai station to catch the overnight train back to Hanoi. You can always extend an extra night in Sapa, allowing more time for trekking and cultural immersion.





Cu Chi Tunnels

Tour the underground system built by Vietnamese guerrilla fighters during the war. Originally built by the Viet Minh, the tunnels were improved and extended by the Viet Cong during the Vietnam War in the 1960s. Private Tour from \$



Explore the Art of Hanoi





Hue City Tour

Tour Hue, Vietnam's former capital for over 140 years. Venture to the Imperial Tomb of Tu Duc—Vietnam's longest-reigning emperor—the Imperial Tomb of Khai Dinh and Vinh Tu garden house.

Halong means "Where the Dragon Descends into the Sea." From the emerald-green waters of Halong Bay, some 3,000 limestone and dolomite islands, or "grottos," rise jaggedly from the Gulf of Tonkin like medieval stone cathedral spires or the scales on a dragon's back. Local lore has it that an enormous dragon created the bay, grottos and outcroppings as it thrashed its way toward the open sea to prevent the intrusion of enemy navies. Today, local fishermen still report encountering a giant sea beast called Tarasque, sort of the Loch Ness Monster of the South China Sea. There is plenty to explore in the 1,500-square-mile body of water, where it is easy to find peaceful places to swim, fish or simply relax without seeing another soul, while surrounded by majestic scenery.





Welcome to Cambodia

Protruding from the jungle, the ancient city of Angkor Wat is the main attraction to visitors of Siem Reap. The city's proximity to the legendary sandstone complex makes it the ideal base camp for day trips and longer itineraries. Relax and unwind in a local restaurant after a long day of exploring the world's largest religious monument or don your walking shoes and set off on the 60-square-miles of passageways and palaces.

Home to some of Southeast Asia's most important archaeological sites, Siem Reap is a gem found within the lush jungles of Cambodia. Find yourself surrounded by temples in every direction as you zip across the dirt roads wondering what will appear beyond the bend. Stretching over 250 square miles, Angkor Archaeological Park contains different capitals of the Khmer Empire that still stand today. Dating all the way back to the 9th to the 15th centuries, some of the most revered temples—including Angkor Wat, Angkor Thom and Bayon—are found on this symbolic site.

As every visitor quickly learns, one of the most fascinating features of the Angkor temples is their uniqueness. Banteay Srei has intricate carvings of sensuous dancers, while Ta Prohm is mostly unrestored with natural foliage surrounding it, weaving throughout the stone walls and temple structure. Bayon shows its many faces with large stone carvings etched into its façade. The most prominent of them all, Angkor Wat, took an estimated 30 years to complete. Angkor Wat is the best-preserved and largest monument of the Angkor group. Its perfection in balance and proportions and intricate carvings make it one of the finest monuments in the world and a must-see on any Asia itinerary.


Nusa Dua

The Sacred Journey

I went on a sacred journey across Asia and visited some of the its oldest temples. Beyond bricks and mortar, what I experienced when I entered these incredible shrines was special. Let me explain why.

Bali

Beginning in Indonesia, my sacred journey led me first to the island province of Bali. World-renowned for its beaches, Bali crackles with an energy reflective of its people. It's cuisine is no different. I took a cooking class and learned how to make traditional Indonesian curries, sambals, and other dishes. Afterward, I set out to see some Bali's fantastic sights. I explored Nusa Penida, an island community known for its world class diving locations and panoramas of the Badung Strait. Finally, I saw the spectacular Tanah Lot Temple. One of seven sea temples set off the Balinese coast, Tanah Lot is a breathtaking representation of historic Balinese culture.



Komodo Island

Named for its most famous inhabitants, Komodo Island is home to the Komodo Dragon. Weighing up to 200 pounds and measuring out at nearly eight and half feet in length, these lizards are modern

day dinosaurs. Yet, the natural

landscape of Komodo Island is just as striking as its residents.
The island is 240 miles of lush greenery, rugged terrain, and picturesque beaches. Komodo Island also features a pink sand beach, one of only seven that exist in the entire world. After snapping some pictures with some new friends, I ate lunch on the pink beach and

listened to the sea.



Yogyakarta and Borobudur

After my adventure in Komodo Island, the sacred journey took me next to the Indonesian city of Yogyakarta. I visited the UNESCO World Heritage-listed site Prambanan Temple, the largest Hindu temple in all of Indonesia. Next was the Taman Sari, a renowned water castle that was built in the mid-18th century. The next morning, I left the hotel at 4:30am to watch the sunrise at the Borobudur. Another UNESCO World Heritage-listed site, the Borobudur is a ninth-century Buddhist Temple that is also one of the world's largest. Watching the sun rise over the spires and arches was magical and a sight that I will never forget.

Singapore

The last stop of my sacred journey brought me to the beautiful country of Singapore. I went on the Heritage Foodalicious Tour, tasted some samples, and learned about a family-run soy sauce business. After, I visited the Gardens by the Bay, a stunning nature park that runs adjacent to the marina reservoir. I ended my trip and my night with a laser light show under the "trees" in the park. Colorful, electric, and beautiful, it was a fitting end to the trip.





Yangon

This spiritual city is located on the mystic banks of the Irrawaddy River, providing a stunning backdrop for the many historical landmarks. Bagan immerses visitors in the culture of Myanmar, from the architecture to activities.




Mandalay

Known as the "last royal city," Mandalay's ornate bridges, temple peaks, monasteries and pagodas contribute to its character. The city's most famous landmark is the Kuthodaw Pagoda, leaving visitors awestruck for centuries. Meditate at the Buddhist temples in the Sagaing region or stroll along the edges of the Irrawaddy River. Another main attraction for tourists is the botanical gardens, decorated in local flowers and plants. Mandalay is an ideal destination for relaxation and exploration.



Inle Lake

Learn about the lifestyles of the indigenous Intha people at Inle Lake. Famous for their stilted houses, residents have adapted to the landscape by learning how to plant their vegetables in floating gardens and becoming skilled fishermen. Explore the lake on a traditional longboat journey before trekking to lavish pagodas. Learn the ways of the peaceful monks at Shwe Yan Pyay Monastery; or be one with the Buddha at the Pindaya Caves, where there are almost 800 Buddha statues.



Bagan has over 2,200 temples and pagodas, and there is no better way to appreciate the view than taking to the skies in a hot air balloon at dawn.



Prepare for an early start, pick up is usually around 5:30am and lift off around 6:00am. Begin your adventure with a short journey to the launch site, where you will be greeted by the crew preparing the balloon. After some morning refreshments and a safety briefing, it's time to take flight!



The balloon is guided by gentle winds, allowing passengers a serene and peaceful view of ancient temples drifting by. After a soft landing, you will be greeted by the crew serving fresh fruit, pastries and a glass or two of sparkling wine.





Dala & Twante

On your way to Shwesandaw Pagoda, travel to Dala and take a trishaw ride past the local fish market for a dose of local legend. Proceed to Twante to see local industries, including bamboo raft and pottery making.



Tokyo


Hiroshima



With this in mind, I journeyed to the "The Land of the Rising Sun" to determine what constitutes a Japanese quintessential. Here are the must-sees and dos that I found.



Kanazawa: Japanese Quintessential

From the moment I read about Kanazawa in college, I was fascinated by the historical samurai town. My day started on foot, touring the classic neighborhood of Nagamachi. I explored Nomura Samurai House, a home that belonged to a wealthy samurai family. The home featured traditional tatami rooms, a family shrine, and a full suit of armor on display. The yard out back was no different, housing both a beautiful garden and a koi pond.

Afterward, I visited the centerpiece of any trip to Kanazawa: Kenrokuen Garden. Spacious, classic, and secluded, the garden is one of the most beautiful in the country. The water features, bridges, teahouses, trees, flowers, and stones make the Garden a Japanese quintessential.

Miyagawa Market and Shirakawago: Japanese Quintessential

My next stop? Miyagawa morning market! Stocked with impressive wood sculptures and intricate pottery, Miyagawa is also an excellent place for snacks. The sesame crackers and taiyakai, a sweet cream-filled cake, were delicious. Once through, I walked the streets of Old Town with charming old-style houses and sake breweries. A wealthy merchant district dating back to the 1600s, Old Town is traditional Japan at its most beautiful.

Next, my journey continued to UNESCO World Heritage-listed town of Shirakawago. Most famous for its Gassho-style farmhouses, Shirakawago homes are built without nails. The roofs, thatched and steeply sloped, look like hands at prayer.

Forest of Wisdom: Japanese Quintessential

My first stop was the small, seven-family town of Hiyou. I was there to see the Forest of Wisdom, a project preserving the cedar trees, moss, and natural resources of the area. Moss is a symbol of Japanese culture and it was magical to see them cultivating endangered varieties of moss in the Forest. After a tasty lunch, I walked to the spectacular Kakusenkei Gorge and soaked in the views.

Afterward, I grabbed a snack at a teahouse perched alongside the river and then made my way back on the interesting bridges of the gorge. At each end of the gorge is a bridge, one traditional wooden bridge and one modern steel bridge which made for an intriguing visual of Japanese history and modernity working together. The Forest and the gorge were a respite from a few busy days of touring.

Maiko Dinner and Show: My Favorite


My favorite stop in Nara was Kasuga Taisha Shrine. Kasuga is most known for the hundreds of bronze lanterns that adorn temple buildings and the stone lanterns that line the pathways of the temple hall. I could have spent hours looking at the lanterns. The older ones were covered in a shiny green moss while the brighter, new ones showed newly painted instructions.



In Kyoto, I participated in my favorite experience on the trip: a Maiko Dinner and Show at Gion Hatanaka. While I enjoyed a traditional seven-course Kyoto Kaiseki dinner, both maiko and geiko performed traditional songs and dances. During a brief break in the performances the ladies came to each table and answered diners' questions. I ended my evening and trip with some fun party games.

These sights and experiences represent the history, culture, and essence of Japan. In short, quintessential Japan, where every day is a new adventure and every interaction a learning experience.



Beijing

Beijing is China's capital and the country's secondlargest city, and it is home to several of the country's most revered icons, with more than 50 museums and cultural centers. Stroll through palaces, temples and parks where emperors once walked. Be sure to visit the alleys, known as hutongs, which give a view into Beijing's cultural past. Though filled with history, Beijing is a modern-day metropolis.



Xi'an



Tshechu, a religious festival meaning "the tenth day," is held annually in various temples, monasteries and dzongs throughout Bhutan. This festival is a grand event when the entire community comes together to be blessed by the elders and participate in traditional entertainment, including colorful performances in elaborate costumes and masks.



Paro

A wide valley covered in fertile rice fields, this picturesque region is the gateway to Bhutan. Accentuating the natural beauty are the many elegant traditional-style houses that dot the valley and surrounding hills. Paro has grown in recent years and offers visitors a choice of restaurants, bakeries and cafes, as well as hiking and temple touring. Home to one of the most iconic monasteries, Taktsang, or Tiger's Nest, this interesting town is a must-do destination.



Thimphu

Thimphu is Bhutan's capital and most modern city; it offers guests an abundance of restaurants, internet cafes, nightclubs and shopping centers. However, it still retains a cultural identity and traditional values amidst the signs of modernization. Thimphu is one of the few towns in Bhutan equipped with ATM banking facilities, and it is a good place to stock up on some currency.



Punakha

At an elevation of 4,000 feet above sea level, Punakha Valley has a pleasant climate with warm winters and hot summers; thus, it offers favorable conditions for rice farming. Visitors to Punakha Dzongkhag will be met with beautiful scenery, as well as the majestic Punakha Dzong. It is the second-oldest and second-largest dzong in Bhutan, and it served as the country's capital from 1637 to 1907.




Bumthang

Bumthang is located in central Bhutan, an area with the greatest abundance of historic and religious sites. Here, temple-touring enthusiasts can find some of the country's oldest monasteries and Buddhist temples. Bumthang Dzongkhag consists of four main valleys: Ura, Chumey, Tang and Choekhor. Carved by ancient glaciers, these wide and scenic valleys draw a large number of tourists each year.



Gangtey

Considered one of the most beautiful spots in Bhutan, Gangtey is a flat valley with very few trees, and it is quite different from the rest of the country. This area is home to Jigme Singye Wangchuk National Park, a natural habitat for a variety of wildlife, including nesting grounds for endangered black-necked cranes. Witness these graceful birds at the Gangtey Monastery, where they spend the winter before returning home to Tibet.



Taktsang Palphug Monastery, also known as Tiger's Nest, is a cultural icon of Bhutan. A popular tourist attraction, this monastery is nothing short of unforgettable. The famous Buddhist structure clings to the side of a mountainous cliff, providing unbelievable views of surrounding mountains and luscious valleys.



Indore netted the countrywide award for the "Cleanest City" for three consecutive years and its reputation is well-earned. I spent the night at the beautiful Radisson Blue hotel before my journey to Maheshwar the next day. In the afternoon, I visited the Lal Baag Palace that belongs to the Holkar royal family. Built in the 1920s, the home is elegant, complete with lavish interior and beautiful gardens. A statue of Queen Victoria sits in the gardens, a nod to Indian history.

Afterward, I toured the night market of Sarafa Bazaar. The Bazaar is a haven for adventurous foodies like myself and I sampled the local delicacies of poha, jalebi, dahi vada and malpuas. Sarafa served as a fitting appetizer for the journey to Maheshwar, the capital of Indian fabrics, the next day.





A Stop in Mandu

After a delicious buffet breakfast at Radisson Blue, I departed to Mandu where I met my guide, Pervez. Together we visited Jahaz Mahal, the Ship Palace. Vast and well-planned, Jahaz Mahal is a sight to behold, sitting like a magnificent vessel between two lakes. Additionaly, I saw my favorite sight in all of Mandu, the Roopmati pavilion. The pavilion provides spectacular views that overlook the Narmada valley and is in close proximity to Baz Bahadur's Palace and Rewa Kund. Maheshwar, Capital of Indian Fabrics



The weavers use beautiful silks and cottons and I bought a Maheshwari sari for myself. I wore it as we walked the small lanes of Maheshwar with its cloth handlooms, art workshops and hotels. The locals were so friendly and greeted us with warm smiles.

After lunch, we took a boat ride on the Narmada river to enjoy the sunset with hot tea and fresh biscuits. Dinner was an Indian thali set up at the courtyard with flowing red flowers and beautiful lit clay oil Indian lamps called diyas. It was the perfect way to end the trip.

I traveled back home attired in my beautiful Maheshwar fabrics and saris. They serve as reminders of my time in India; a fulfilling and wondrous time.







Days 1-2: Fly USA to Thimphu

(via Bangkok)

Today will begin your customized itinerary as you fly from the USA to Thimphu via Bangkok. On arrival in the bustling city of Bangkok, link up with your prearranged transfer and be driven to your accommodations.

Days 3-4: Thimphu

Hike through Punakha to Khamsum Yulley Namgyal Chorten, a fine example of Bhutanese architecture and artistic traditions. Built on a beautiful ridge above Punakha Valley, this four-story temple has been dedicated to the well-being of the kingdom and its people. The Chorten was built to remove the negative forces and promote peace, stability and harmony.



Days 7-8: Gangtey

Begin the drive to Gangtey, where you will closely view the mesmerizing black mountain ranges, as well as the beautiful Phobjukha Valley. Explore Phobjukha Valley and Gangtey Monastery. The Phobjukha Valley is a marshland in Bhutan best known for its cultural uniqueness.

Explore Gangtey through a short hike. The hiking trail starts from the Mani stone wall to the north of the Gangtey Gonpa and ends in Khewa Lhakhang, passing through pine forests and small bamboo plants.

Days 9-10: Paro

Drive to Paro while stopping to view the Paro Dzong, which means "Fortress on a heap of jewels." This dzong is the finest example of Bhutanese architecture. Also stop by the National Museum in Paro Ta Dzong whose collection preserves a snapshot of the rich cultural traditions of the country. Taktsang Monastery is perched on the side of a vertical cliff. A slightly more challenging hike, the Taktsang Monastery

is the best known of the 13 caves in which Guru Padmasambhava meditated. Located close to the Paro Airport, the Kyichu Lhakhang is an important Himalayan Buddhist Temple.

Day 11: Fly Paro to USA

(via Bangkok)



The following Terms and Conditions represent the agreement you enter with Swain Destinations when submitting payment for any services provided by Swain Australia Tours (2003) Inc. doing business as Swain Destinations (collectively "Swain"). Please read these terms and conditions carefully prior to submitting payment.

A. Limited Principal and Agent Relationship

These Terms and Conditions establish a relationship of principal and agent between you, as principal, and Swain, as agent. As your agent, Swain acts pursuant to your authority and may bind you only to the extent of such authority. Swain may dispose of funds received from you only with your express authorization. By these Terms and Conditions, you grant Swain such express authorization for the purpose of booking travel. Swain is also an agent of transportation carriers and other third-party suppliers of services ("suppliers"). All suppliers are independent contractors. When coordinating travel services, Swain receives funds from you and transmits those funds to suppliers. In exchange, suppliers provide you with travel services, which are coordinated by Swain. Swain is a broker between suppliers and customers. Swain receives only a portion of the funds collected from you as a commission, which compensates Swain for services it has rendered to you.

B. Payment Schedule

For airfare arrangements, the full fare must be paid at time of booking. All airfare payments are in addition to the booking deposits for land arrangements.

All travelers must pay a \$500 non-refundable land deposit, per person, at the time of reservation and, if applicable, the non-refundable insurance premium. Certain special or customized itineraries may require an additional deposit. Final payment is due 60 days prior to departure. For Africa Travel, a 25% land deposit of the total booking cost is due at time of reservation and, if applicable, the non-refundable insurance premium. Final payment is due 100 days prior to departure. Certain special or customized itineraries may require an additional deposit. For late bookings within 30 days of departure, full payment is due immediately. An additional fee of \$50 per person will be charged for rush handling.
