To climb to new heights and view the spectacular sights and scenery from atop the Sydney Harbour Bridge.


To experience everything that Australia has to offer.

# The Twelve Apostles

Formed over the course of millions of years, the limestone stacks off the coast of Port Campbell National Park known as the Twelve Apostles are a sight not to miss when visiting Victoria. The drive from Melbourne is an event unto itself as you take in the mind-blowing continuous coastline of the Great Ocean Road.

The seven stacks (originally eight but never actually twelve) naturally eroded by the waves crashing against the cliffs over many years, forming caves which eventually collapsed, leaving only the limestone formations seen today.




the clouds dissipated and the sea stacks appeared like giants in the mist



#### Uluru

Uluru is a spiritual center of the Australian Outback. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Uluru rises 1,140 feet from the ground and measures over 5.5 miles around, acting as a natural monolith coming from the land. The sandstone is known to change in appearance throughout the day, and is just as spectacular taken in from afar as it is up close.



As a sacred site to the Anangu people, a collective of Aboriginal tribes who work to teach Tjukurpa (the traditonal stories, spirituality, and law of the land), Uluru offers an immersive look into the history of Australia through authentic experiences with local indigenous guides.




#### Great Barrier Reef

As the largest living reef in the world, the Great Barrier Reef is a sight that should not be missed on any trip to Australia. Thousands of species of marine life call this formation home and getting up close is the best way to fully appreciate the beautiful complexity that is the Great Barrier Reef.

from the air, the immensity of the reef takes your breath away, while snorkeling feels like an intimate education of its ecosystem

Base yourself on Lizard Island or Hamilton Island for easy access to a multitude of areas of the reef. Expert guides accompany you out to the reef to teach you about the ecosystem, reef regeneration programs, and the importance of the reef to the region.



Venture out to different areas of the reef, including remote sand cays and landmarks like Heart Reef. Snorkel with a guide to see the marine life in their natural habitat or go diving for a much closer encounter.





## Daintree Rainforest

The Oldest rainforest in the world at around 180 million years old, the Daintree is home to over 400 bird species and rare and prehistoric flora, making it the most biologically diverse flora and fauna in the world. Waking up to the sounds of the rainforest at Silky Oaks Lodge is an experience you won't soon forget.


exploring prehistoric wilderness in a eacophony of wildlife sounds is just surreal

This is Kuku Yulanji country, a people whose ancient culture is centered around a deep respect for nature and an intimate knowledge of its cycles. One of the most authentic and rewarding ways to explore the Daintree is a guided tour with a local Aboriginal guide through Mossman Gorge.



Explore Kuku Yulanji country and learn about the environment, different bush foods and medicines, sample some seasonal bush tucker while appreciating the history, culture, and traditions of the Australian Aboriginal people.





## Blue Mountains

Estimated to be approximately 470 million years old, the natural formations that make up the Blue Mountains are something that any adventure seeker will want to experience for themselves.

The name comes from the natural phenomenon where the mountains take on a subtle blue tinge when viewed from a distance, believed to be caused by the abundance of eucalyptus trees in the region.



# Sydney

There is always tons to do and see in this vibrant city. The Sydney Opera House and the Sydney Harbour Bridge are two of the most photographed icons in Australia, but climbing the Harbour Bridge is the best way to enjoy a stunning 360-degree view of the glittering bay below.

See the city come to life on New Year's Eve from a chartered yacht on the bay, or take in the lights of Vivid Sydney, an annual light festival which takes place from late May through mid June.
